
Life on high

SYDNEY LANDSCAPE designer Adam Robinson works closely with clients to craft beautiful outdoor spaces, such as this Redfern rooftop oasis. "I set out to create an area that, even when you know you're smack bang in the middle of the city, once you are on the roof you are completely immersed in a garden presence," he says. Adam zoned the space adding comfortable furniture and a built-in barbecue to deliver a kitchen, living and dining room in one. "The area needs to be usable as well as aesthetically pleasing," Adam says. Rooftop gardens come with challenges; Adam had to choose pieces and plants that could withstand direct exposure to sun, rain and wind. A 360-degree pivoting shade sail, a worthwhile investment, lets the homeowners protect different areas depending on the weather and time of day. When creating your own space, Adam recommends choosing features carefully. "Sometimes one impressive piece is better then lots of clutter," he says.
